WORKSHOPS' DESCRIPTION

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In our workshop we aim to

- **test apps and strategies** based on an individual approach in terms of their selection and description,
- to present a pragmatic take on using metacognitive strategies and online politeness strategies in FL instruction and
- indicate structures for creating teaching and learning activities/sequences to be used by autonomous learners and empowered instructors.

Participants will choose sets of apps, tools and strategies to **design new teaching activities** either for particular language skills or for integrated skills. The newly designed **teaching activities will also be discussed in groups,** in order to ensure feedback and create a new teaching sequence.

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In this workshop, participants will reflect on the potential impact of gamification on their teaching practice. Prototypes of language learning games and how they can be used in a language learning situation will be presented. Moreover, participants will test a VR environment prototype for language learning.

- VR environment—workshop testing
 - step 1: vocabulary acquisition
 - step 2: knowledge consolidation

All prototypes are developed by Malmö University students as their final thesis projects in collaboration with IO2 teachers from the universities of Malmö and Viadrina.

This workshop will allow the participants to **test and explore a teachers' interactive guide** designed and aimed at providing them with sources, tools and concepts that may be key in the development and improvement of their teaching practices.

Participants will first be given some time to explore the guide freely according to their needs and interests. Afterwards, they will be asked to carry out several searching activities on the guide.

At the end of the workshop, they will have space for discussion, feedback and reflection.

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The aim of our workshop is:

- presenting a prototype of badges system for the recognition of informal foreign language learning
- testing an implementation of this prototype on an open-source platform (Moodle)
- discussing the prototype

Participants will first play the role of students completing a weekly report of their informal activities in a chosen foreign language; then, they will be asked to give their feed-back about that experience and about the functionality of the badges system.

PROJECT PRESENTATION

Annick Rivens Mompean, the scientific coordinator of the DIAL4U project, is a Professor in Language Didactics at the University of Lille and head of the Center for Languages of the University that offers 23 languages to the students, several self-guided language centers and certifications. She is a member of the STL research laboratory (UMR 8163) and her research interests involve online language learning and communication, formal and informal learning, the design of Learning environments, learner autonomy development. She is particularly interested in the recognition of informal learning activities, through reflexive and innovative tools that facilitate a lifelong learning process. As the DIAL4U scientific coordinator, she is in charge of the design and the supervision of the scientific project's development and the production of the Intellectual Outputs, in coordination with the partners, relying on didactics concepts that were articulated through the 4 lOs.

Monika Grabowska is an Assistant Professor in the Institute of Romance Studies of the University of Wrocław (Poland), member of the Department of French Linguistics and of the Laboratory of Methodology of French as a Foreign Language. She is a certified teacher of French and, amongst other distinctions, in 2016 was awarded the medal of the National Education Commission for special merits for education. Since 2020, she has also been a member of the board of Polish Academic Society of French Studies "Plejada". Author of 80 papers in Linguistics and Methodology of French as a Foreign Language; her book "L'apprentissage informel des langues étrangères" will be published by L'Harmattan (France) in early 2023.
